First group: 11.00–17.00

Trip to the Museum-Estate of M. Yu. Lermontov "Tarkhany". The State Lermontov Museum "Tarkhany" is a unique historical place not only in Penza region, but throughout Russia and around the world! The late 18th Century–early 19th Century estate is located in the village of Lermontovo (formerly Tarkhany) in the Belinsky District of Penza region. It has an area of 485,3 acres. The museum register lists about 29,000 items, including 14,500 fixed assets. The museum is a vast architectural ensemble that includes several complexes. The Tarkhany Museum was opened in 1939 in the estate of Elizaveta Alekseevna Arsenyeva, the grandmother of the poet Mikhail Lermontov. He spent 13 years of his life in Tarkhany. Visitors go to an old Russian estate, walk through the rooms of the manor house that stores

Lermontov's relics. The guided tour includes a tour of the estate, the manor house, the house of the housekeeper, the family church of Mary of Egypt built in memory of the poet's mother who died early in life. Visitors see an ancient icon of the Archangel Michael, whose face was copied from the portrait of Lermontov.

Second group: 11.00–12.00 (14.00–15.00)

Visit to the Museum of One Painting named after G. V. Myasnikov. The real pride of Penza and Penza residents is the unique museum in the world – the Museum of One Painting – a branch of the Penza Picture Gallery. It was opened in 1983 in a 19th century mansion. The Forbes magazine has



published a list of 6 unique museums of the world, and the Museum of One Painting is on the list holding the third place. It is among such world museums as the Museum of the Turin Shroud in Milan, the Liberty Bell Museum in Philadelphia, the Museum of the Moon on the Earth Satellite and the Museum ship in Sweden. Viewing a work of art is preceded by a video showing the era in which the work was created, allowing visitors to discover the amazing inner world of the artist, his ideas, intentions, and experiences. The session lasts 45 minutes. At the end of the film the curtain opens and the audience sees a picture, the description of which is accompanied by text and music. This year the Museum of One Picture displays the work of I. K. Aivazovsky "Coastal City. The view of Yalta".

The conference committee organizes a visit to the Museum of One Painting at any other time convenient for the conference participants.

The admission fee is 150 rubles (tickets are paid by the participants themselves).
